Application Process

The applicant first must have a pre-application interview during which time the nature, conditions and requirements of the program are explained, and the applicant and interviewer decide whether this program is a the right fit for the applicant.

This program is for people who are:

- Self-resourced; able to put together the program they want, responsible for creating its content
- Into further rigorous learning and development
- Have a plan for development and learning
- Able to find mentors; aware enough of PW and community that they can find mentors

After the pre-application interview, the applicant must submit the following materials:

- Application form (see below).
- Essay answering the questions listed on the form.
 - Please send the form and essay in electronic form (either Word doc or PDF file) to pwi@processwork.org.
- Two letters of recommendation from Process Work diplomates sent by them directly to PWI at pwi@processwork.org. These should NOT come from the applicant's personal therapist.
- Application fee of \$75 which may be paid by check, cash, credit card or wire transfer. Please contact PWI for details.

If these materials are accepted, the applicant is invited to a telephone interview with two members of the admissions committee.
